

Spring 2023 Rush:

Fraters, rush this semester looked a little different than it has in semesters past. After the window for extending bids had closed and we had handed out 18 bids we were notified that Clarkson's limited window to accept the bid violated IFC guidelines. To comply with this regulation, it was decided by the Office of Student Life that a Continuous Open Bidding (COB) period would be instituted. This meant that we would have an additional two weeks to hand out bids to prospective new members. The COB period closed on February 10th and we handed out an additional 2 bids. Of the initial 14 bids we handed out, 9 accepted, 4 deferred, and 1 denied. The 2 bids we handed out during COB were both accepted, with one changing from the earlier deferral decision.

talk TKE specifics and discuss any concerns or questions they may have had. Below is a picture from the event and the associated rush poster for that event.





Regional Leadership Conference (RLC)

This year we had 21 brothers from the lota Kappa chapter attend the Regional Leadership Conference in Jersey City. This included 17 active brothers and 4 alumni. This is the largest number of brothers we have had register and attend to date. We even had two brothers (Jared Jimenez & Brian Williams) speak on the Top TKE Chapter Panel in front of the whole conference. The brothers of lota Kappa were able to attend many of the workshops put on at RLC focusing on recruitment, risk management, philanthropy and many other topics all while building their TKE network and exchanging ideas with other chapters. These workshops and other events at RLC helped to rekindle many brother's passions for different aspects of our fraternity and was a great check-in at this point in the semester. There was a noticeable change in the chapter after this conference in terms of preparing for rush next semester, focusing on how to raise more for St. Jude, how to make our chapter meetings more efficient, and how to secure a Top TKE award this year.

Philanthropy

Our Philanthropy goal for this academic year is set at \$32,000. Currently, we are sitting at \$17,844 with some funds from recent philanthropy events not yet added. We are in a good position to hit this large goal with some key events remaining in the semester. We have been continuing to hold TKE Tuesday bake sales (often not on Tuesdays), which brings in money every two weeks. In addition to this we created two Super Bowl Squares boards, one for \$10 buy in and one for \$25 buy in. This event helped us to raise around \$1,500 for St. Jude. In addition to these events we also have our annual Freeze a TEKE event coming up which always raises around \$100 per brother. These events in combination with TEKE week coming up in April will put us in a prime position to hit our lofty goal.
